Format:	9 Rounds Swiss System , computer pairing with Swiss Chess Time Control: 90 minutes for the game + 30 seconds per move From the 2nd till the 5th round, it's possible to once switch to the grenke Freestyle Chess Open . The switch must be registered before the pairing of the respective round. Points earned in the grenke Chess Open will be carried over. Default time: 30 minutes (For Round 1, the default time will be announced at the opening)

	<p>of the tournament determine the group allocation. If a rating limit is exceeded after registration, the player must switch to the corresponding higher tournament.</p> <p>For participation in the A-Open, it is sufficient if the required rating was achieved at least once during the registration period.</p>																
Players without DWZ and Elo Rating:	Foreign players without DWZ (German National Rating) or ELO Rating require a written confirmation of playing strength (e.g. national rating) from their chess federation. For German players without a rating, the tournament director decides on participation in A-, B-, or C-Open (pre-registration requested).																
Prizes:	<p>All prizes are guaranteed. Each player can only win one prize (except team prizes). In the event of a tie, Buchholz will be used as the tiebreaker.</p> <p>The main prizes in the A-Open are distributed according to the Hort system. Special prizes and rating prizes, as well as the prizes in the B- and C-Open, are not shared. Special prizes are awarded only if there are at least 5 participants per category.</p> <p>Rating prizes in the A- and B-Open are awarded based on TWZ. TWZ is the Elo rating if available, otherwise the DWZ rating is used.</p> <p>Attendance at the awards ceremony is mandatory for prize money payouts.</p> <p>Prize money for persons not subject to tax in Germany is handled in accordance with the German Income Tax Act (EStG).</p>
